### Reallocation of CDBG Funds for PY19 CARES Act Allocation

In April and November of 2020, the City of Columbus received notification of allocation of CARES Act funding for the City of Columbus. Substantial amendments were submitted in the determination of immediate needs to prepare for, prevent, and respond to the Coronavirus Pandemic. It has been determined the Turning Point Emergency Residential Shelter has noted an increase in domestic violence due to the pandemic. To address the need for renovations to increase capacity at the shelter, the City completed an amendment to reallocate the CARES Act Funding within approved projects to provide funding for the needed renovations and improvements to this community facility in September 2022. When the quotes for the project were received, the project costs had escalated. The city is completing a substantial amendment to utilize the balance of the CDBG CV funding towards the much-needed renovations and improvements to the Turning Point Emergency Residential Shelter to increase the capacity by 15 beds.

The beneficiaries of the amendment are considered low-to-moderate income based on the limited clientele classification of victims of domestic violence.
